

The other Band Directors that you will be working with during the coming school year are:

Mr. Todd Burke-Head director at Horn HS. Mr. Burke will be working with the woodwind classes. Mr. Burke's expertise is on the saxophone, but he is also an excellent clarinet and double reed teacher. Mr. Burke has been the band director at Horn HS since the school opened.

Helping Mr. Lozano with the brass classes will be Mr. Lynn Childers. Mr. Childers is the new assistant director at Horn. He will be working with the low brass students, mostly, but can teach all brass instruments. While Mr. Childers is new to Horn, he is not new to Mesquite having taught in the district for several years.

Mr. Craig Hill is the assistant director in charge of percussion studies. A non-native (he's from Ohio) he came to Texas as soon as he could. Mr. Hill is also the youngest member of the staff, but probably also one of the most knowledgeable for his particular instrument.

Another staff member you may see at times during the year is Mr. Scott Rives. Mr. Rives will be working primarily at Berry MS, but may be able to come to Terry from time to time. Mr. Rives is a brass teacher.
